When Rome Partied...

During the late December to early March, the ancient Romans celebrated three different major religious festivals. They are the Saturnalia, the Lupercalia, and the Equiria.

The Saturnalia was held during the Empire. It lasted for a modern week from December 17 to December 23. This week is also the period during which the winter solstice occurs. This celebration was intended to recall the



Golden Age's perfect peace and happiness. During the period of the festival all executions at military operations were postponed and visits

and gifts were exchanged. Also, the slaves were given freedom and could sit at an honored place at meals and were served by the masters. This festival is named for Jupiter's father, Saturn, who ruled during the Golden Age.

On February 15, a festival honoring Lupercus, a pastoral god of the Italians began. The festival, called the Lupercalia, was celebrated at the cave of Lupercal on the Palatine Hill. This cave is the mythical site of the den of the she-wolf who nursed the twins Romulus and Remus.

The final festival, the Equiria, was celebrated twice, on February 27 and on March 14. It was in honor of Mars, which was appropriate because it was this time of year when military campaigns were being prepared. Horse races in the Campus Martius were a major part of the


They have about four socials a year, most of which are water-skiing parties. The Latin Club is the largest foreign language club at West Orange and has the highest G.P.A. on campus.



Sandalwood's Michael Lee dresses in Roman apparel as he prepares to march in the Homecoming Parade.






Sandalwood High School Latin Club

Sandalwood participates in a neighborhood canned food drive and makes stocking stuffers. They also plan to visit the Alexander the Great exhibit in St. Petersburg.




Togate girls from Sandalwood display their school spirit in the Homecoming Parade.


Club of the Month






