



Going to the opening general assembly at my first National Junior Classical League Forum, I had no idea what to expect except the endless boring administrative matters about which many of the students had warned me. The large amount of crazy Latin students, all excited about being at competition during the summer, caught me off guard. To find myself in the company of so many like-minded students was one of the best experiences of the summer. However surprised I was about the spirit of those around me, it was nothing compared to how I felt when the director of scholastic services for the National Junior Classical League, Mr. David Volk, announced the recipient of the NJCL Latin Honor Society scholarship. Having been completely overwhelmed by the size of the National Junior Classical League, I had failed to look at the program of speakers for the assembly. I did not realize that one of the scholarships for which I applied would be called so early in the week, I was dumbfounded through the announcement of my name as the recipient. It was a great honor and pleasure to receive the award and I would like to personally thank all of the members of the Florida delegation that supported me.

I highly suggest that any high school senior who has been a part of the NJCL for the past three years and who plans to major in the Classics (studies or language) apply for this scholarship. The qualifications are limited. As outlined in the application on the NJCL website (www.njcl.org/activities), applicants must have been a member in good standing of the NJCL for at least three years, be a member of the NJCL Latin Honor Society for the current academic year and at least one preceding year, and be planning to teach Latin or the Classics. The application requires an essay on 'what honor and excellence mean to me' as well as a transcript and three recommendations (Latin teacher, school administrator, and person in the community). There are very few scholarships for future Latin teachers that have such few requirements as this one does, especially one that is worth \$1500. Every little scholarship you get adds up. Apply if you can!

Hey, Are You A Senior? Do You like Free Money?

Students who are seniors and plan to study Latin in their freshman year of college are eligible to take the FJCL Scholarship exam. The exam consists of two passages to translate and questions (grammar and comprehension) relating to those passages. After February 1st, 2008, students may request the application. They must return the completed application form to Linda Mishkin (see below). The exam will then be sent to a guidance counselor at the student's school. Students must take and return the exam by March 17, 2008. The winning student (and an alternate) will be announced at State Forum. This scholarship is worth \$500.
