NLE Preparation

It's that time of year again...The National Lain Exam is quickly approaching. The NLE is an exam designed to test an individual's knowledge on the subject of Latin, including comprehension, mythology, Roman life, history, derivatives, and a series on questions based on a short passage written in Latin. The exam is open to anyone who is currently enrolled in or has completed a Latin course in that academic year. There are exams available for Latin I, II, III, Latin III-IV Prose, Latin III-IV Poetry, and Latin V-VI. This year testing is the week of March 14-18, 2011. Tests are given for forty-five minutes.

There are also awards given to those who show exceptional scoring on the NLE. Perfect papers receive a hand-written certificate. Top scorers

receive a gold medal and a Summa Cum Laude certificate. Second place receive a silver medal and a Maxima Cum Laude certificate, third place a Magna Cum Laude certificate, and fourth place a Cum Laude certificate. In addition to these awards, special awards are given. If an individual earns four gold medals, the receive the Maureen O'Donnell Award, and individuals who earn three or more perfect papers, or five or more gold medals receive the Carter Stubbs Drake Goad Award. There is also a \$1000 Scholarship available.

To enter, there is a \$4 fee for entries in the United States. Applications were due by January 18, 2011.For more information, visit http://www.nle.org/. To those who are taking the National Latin Exam this year, Bona Fortuna!
